LET BROTHERLY LOVE CONTINUE Heb. 13:1

INTRO:

- 1. These four words are still appropriate today.
- 2. *Philadelphia*, which means brotherly love, not agape as in 1 Cor. 13.

I. AGAPE AND PHILOS – TWO WORDS MEANING LOVE.

- A. There is a definite distinction between the two.
- B. Agape expresses unselfish benevolence; there it is commanded by God. Matt. 22:37-39; Matt. 5:44
- C. Philos is founded on sense and emotion.

II. FIVE SIGNS OF A LACK OR PROPER LOVE FOR THE BRETHREN.

- A. When we are prone to neglect the assembly. **Heb. 10:25**
- B. When we say ugly things about brethren.
 - 1. Two rules: Never believe anything bad about anyone unless you positively know for a fact that it is true. Never tell even that unless it is absolutely necessary and that God is listening while you tell it.
 - 2. Running from one to another with tales of ill treatment is wrong. **Prov. 6:16, 18; 2 Thess. 3:11**
- C. When we lightly consider the feeling and convictions of other brethren. Gal. 6:1; Matt. 5:43,44
- D. When we promote a spirit of division in one or more congregations. Psalm 133:1; Eph. 4:3; Prov. 6:19
- E. When we forget to practice genuine hospitality among ourselves and with strangers. **Heb. 13:1, 2**

CONC:

- 1. Love tends to be contagious so if I show it in my life, it may begin to spread to others.
- 2. Developing love won't help in eternity unless I am a Christian and only comes through obeying the gospel. 2 Thess. 1:7-10
