GET IN THE BASKET PROVERBS 3:5,6

- 1. Balloons look so quiet and peaceful.
- 2. However, to rise requires loud blasts of hot air.
- 3. Sometimes they are racing across the sky, sometimes hovering.
- 4. They are never alone always at the mercy of an invisible force.
- 5. The pilot is never totally in control wind dictates so much.

I. IT IS ALL ABOUT TRUSTING THE UNSEEN.

- A. John 1:18
- B. Though we have never seen God, Jesus has revealed him through his life and word. John 14:9-11; John 20:29

II. I MUST COMMIT MY TRUST TO GOD.

- A. I will not always have a smooth flight, but I will be secure.
- B. Sometimes a life committed to God seems as confining as being in a basket under a balloon.
- C. However, when I am fully committed, I can forget the basket and enjoy the beauty of life.
- D. I am totally dependent on God, no longer in control, but free, safe, and secure with God's leading. Rom. 6:22; 8:1,2; John 8:36, 32
- E. I need to let go and let God.

III. LETTING GO IS NOT EASY.

- A. Many things hold us back from flights of faith.
- B. What prevents you from climbing in the basket and taking off with God?
- Sometimes people look with envy at the folks in the basket, wishing they were up there soaring above all the difficulty and ugliness of life – so peaceful, so serene.
- 2. However, many of these same people are not sure they would get in the basket and leave the seeming safety of the ground.
- 3. Peace comes when there is no doubt that God is in control.
- 4. Actually climb into the basket with God and experience true freedom and joy.
