- Many transformations are possible today.
- Most fantastic transformation is discussed in Romans 6.
- 3. Occurs when one becomes a Christian. 1 Cor. 6:9-11; 1:2

I. WHAT IS THIS TRANSFORMATION?

- A. We were in sin, but now are dead to sin. Rom. 6:1, 2, 11
- B. We were our old selves, but now we live a new life. Rom. 6:3-6
- C. We were slaves to sin, but now we are free from sin.

Rom. 6:6, 7,17,18,16, 20-23

II. HOW DOES THIS TRANSFORMATION HAPPEN?

- A. We are saved by grace. Rom. 6:23
- B. We are saved by grace through Jesus Christ. Rom. 6:23; 5:8, 9, 11
- C. Our salvation is accepted by faith. Rom. 5:1; Eph. 2:8; Rom. 6:17, 18, 3-5

III. PAUL AS AN EXAMPLE.

- A. We are introduced to him as Saul the persecutor. Acts 7:57-8:3
- B. He then had an encounter with the resurrected Lord. Acts 9:1-9, 17-22
- C. Ultimately, he was stoned himself, but survived. Acts 14:19, 20

IV. WHAT ARE THE RESULTS OF THIS TRANSFORMATION?

- A. A new life. Rom. 6:4, 11
- B. This is a changed life.
 - 1. Should not sin because been freed from sin. vv. 2, 9-11
 - Should not sin because lives a new life. v. 4
 - 3. Should not sin because he is now God's slave. v. 18
 - 4. Should not sin because he will perish if he sins. vv. 21-23
- C. Paul put it like this. 2 Tim. 4:6-8

CONC:

- 1. Then, how should the transformed person live?
 - a. Negatively. Rom. 6:12
 - b. Positively. Rom. 6:13 "Take My Life and Let It Be"
- 2. The great transformation ultimately results in eternal life. **Rom. 6:23**
