LIKE HIM IN THIS WORLD 1 John 4:17

INTRO:

- 1. Of all the New Testament writers, John states the greatest truths in the simplest terms.
 - a. Can you say it in shorter words?
 - b. Can you say a greater truth in any words?
- 2. Though we could make application in many directions, I want us to notice this verse in its simplest form.

I. "AS HE IS..."

- A. Not "as he was."
 - 1. Jesus Christ never changes. Heb. 13:8
 - 2. There is only one thing Jesus ever "was" -- he was dead, but he is not now. **Rev. 1:18**
- B. When John saw Jesus in his resurrected body, it knocked him out! **Rev. 1:17**
- C. Jesus Christ is the eternal contemporary.

II. "As He Is, SO ARE WE..."

- A. Christians are like him in kind, but not in degree.
 - 1. We are partakers of his nature.
 - 2. What is his is ours.
- B. In the Christian, Christ lives again.
 - 1. He does not say, "As he is, we should be." or "As he is, we will be."
 - 2. We should be what we are.

III. "As He Is, So Are We, IN THIS WORLD."

- A. He had a hard time here and left us a legacy of tribulation and suffering. Phil. 3:10; John 15:18
- B. He said in John 17:18; 2 Cor. 5:17
- C. Christians are married to Christ. Rom. 7:1-4
- D. All things are his and ours, except ourselves. 1 Cor. 6:19
- E. His friends are our friends, and his enemies are our enemies. Phil. 3:18; James 4:4; Luke 2:34; Acts 28:22;1 Cor. 4:13
- F. His future is our future. 2 Timothy 2:12; 1 Cor. 6:2

- 1. Are you married to the heavenly bridegroom?
- 2. "As he is, so are we in this world!"
